**training course**: The purpose of the workshop is to provide useful knowledge and

regulatory practices on safety assessment in topical areas of electrical power and I&C systems of nuclear power plants

(NPPs).

Qualifications: Candidates should have a science or engineering degree,

preferably related to nuclear energy and be professional staff of Nuclear Safety Regulatory Bodies or Technical Support

Organizations (TSO).

As the workshop will be conducted in English, participants

should have sufficient proficiency to follow lectures and express

themselves in this language without difficulty.

Nature of the

workshop: This activity was proposed by the Education and Training

Topical Group within the framework of the Asian Nuclear Safety Network (ANSN). The objective of the ANSN is to pool, analyse and share existing and new technical knowledge; and practical experience to further improve the safety of nuclear

installations in Asia.

## Application procedure:

Nominations need to follow the ANSN online nomination process (www.ANSN.org). And then, if required by the participant's authorities, the completed forms should be endorsed by and returned through the established official channels (the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the National Atomic Energy Authority or the office of the United Nations Development Programme). They must be received by the International Atomic Energy Agency, P.O. Box 100, A-1400, Vienna with copy to Mr. Se Won Kim (k119ksw@kins.re.kr) FAX +82-42-8614046, **no later than the deadline for nominations**. Nominations received after that date or applications which have not been routed through one of the aforementioned channels cannot be considered.

In case of technical problems with the online procedure advance nominations can be sent via e-mail to Mr. Ho Kee Kim (H.Kim@iaea.org), Project Manager Officer. The e-mail should contain the following basic information about the candidate(s): name, age, sex, academic qualifications, present position including exact nature of duties carried out, proficiency in English, and full working address (including telephone and fax numbers and e-mail) to enable the IAEA to make preliminary evaluation of the candidates.

# Administrative and financial arrangements:

Nominating Governments will be informed in due course of the names of the selected candidates and will at that time be given full details on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

During their stay at the workshop, participants will be provided with their accommodation, food, and minor incidental expenses by the host organizer (Korea Institute of Nuclear Safety).
